### **Introduction to Wilderness Survival: RLS 11300.LST1**

Lab Fee: \$10

Student Max: 30

2 Credit Hours

This course will introduce students to basic emergency preparedness skills to enhance their preparation for participation in outdoor, life-time sport activities. This course includes an overnight field experience simulating a survival situation..

Topics to be covered will be cave creations, biological life forms and natural formations, safety, proper equipment, and climbing techniques. There will be a lab portion to the class held at Meramec State Park in which the students will have the opportunity to apply knowledge and skills covered in the classroom portion of the course.

### **Special Topics: Raising the Rafters: Evolution of American Old Time Music: AST 38600.LST3**

Lab Fee: \$0

3 Credit Hours

Using the end of the Colonial period as a starting point, this course will trace the development of the instruments and singing styles that have formed the foundation of present-day American Old Time music. The evolution of the banjo from its African roots to the playing styles of the twentieth century, the transition from violin music to the pollination of fiddle tunes and regional playing styles, and the development of the Appalachian Dulcimer from its European background will all be explored.

The course will also trace both the Ballad tradition and the development and history of the Shape Note singing movement, all in all presenting a comprehensive overview of this facet of Traditional American Music.

**From ILLINOIS/ST. LOUIS: U.S. 40/61:** WEST across the Boone Bridge, Exit at Hwy 94. Turn LEFT (South), travel 8 miles to Hwy F. Turn RIGHT, the Boone Campus is 5 miles on the LEFT.

**From WESTBOUND I-70:** SOUTH (Left) on Hwy 94 (First Capitol Drive) approximately 20 miles to Hwy F. Turn RIGHT, travel 5 miles, the Boone Campus is on the LEFT.

**From EASTBOUND I-70:** Take the Foristell Exit (Hwy T). Travel to the Hwy T/Hwy D intersection, continue traveling straight on Hwy D. Continue into the town of New Melle, turn RIGHT on Hwy F, the Boone Campus is 5 miles on the RIGHT.

**From WASHINGTON, MO I-44 EAST:** NORTH on Hwy 47, turn RIGHT at Hwy 94. Travel through the town of Dutzow to the intersection of 94 and TT. Continue straight on TT until Hwy T. Turn RIGHT on Hwy T. Follow T 1 1/2 miles to Cappelln Osage Road (to village of Femme Osage). Turn LEFT and follow Cappelln Osage Road to Femme Osage Creek Road to Highway F, turn RIGHT and travel 1 mile. The Boone Campus is on the right.
